Grass Growers of Red Cliffs

At a meeting at the golf club on Monday 3rd May a partnership was formed that has the potential to secure the financial future of the Red Cliffs Golf Club. Nineteen individual investors, all members of the Red Cliffs Golf Club, put up \$25,000.00 as start up capital to establish a commercial turf nursery at the golf club. The other member of the partnership is the Red Cliffs Golf Club that has put up the land, an irrigation water allocation, labour and machinery usage.

The eventual aim of the project is for the enterprise to be wholly owned by the Red Cliffs Golf Club. As the project becomes more profitable the 19 individual investors will be bought out leaving the golf club as the sole owner. During the formative years of the project 50% of any profit will be allocated to the individual investors and 50% to the golf club. There are also plans to expand the area sown to turf as the project develops, but these expansion plans will only go ahead as finances permit.

As President Rod indicated in his article in this newsletter this is a big step for the club but is one that had to be taken if the club was to get out of the downwards financial spiral it has been in over recent years. Those of you that were at last year's AGM will remember the auditor commenting that the club could not continue to operate for very much longer unless the financial situation was turned around.

It is important that all members of the club look upon the turf project as theirs and not something that belongs to someone else. Whilst it is true that there are a number of members who have a direct financial interest in the project, every member who is concerned about the long-term future of the Red Cliffs Golf Club must get behind the project to ensure that it is successful. There will be times when members will be needed to help out and without that support the project will not be successful, so if you are called upon to help get stuck in.

Notes from the General Committee

- Debt has been reduced by \$30,000 compared with the end of the last club financial year. Creditors have been reduced by \$20,000 over the same period.
- Small sub-committee to be formed to look at additional aspects of sponsorship, particularly on the course. Corporate golf packages are also a potential along with a variety of social events.
- There was quite a lot of discussion about membership classification due mainly to some recent requests for pro-rata memberships. There was agreement to alter the terms of the Temporary membership category to allow for monthly membership at twice the Ordinary member rate.
- A suggestion was discussed to alter the terms of the ball competition to exclude players who have already won a trophy on the day. The matter was referred to the Match Committee for deliberation.
- Several new members were accepted into the club.

- Golf Club raffle. This on-going fund raiser is going really well so please continue to support Judy Dean and Julie Warne by helping to sell the tickets and returning ticket stubs and money promptly.

There is quite a lot of tree planting happening particularly adjacent to the 3rd and the 5th. The new renovation between the men's and ladies 3rd tees will be also worth watching. Finally the redevelopment of the 15th green is really coming along well. Not a bad list for a club with such limited staff resources.
