Notes from the General Committee

The General Committee meeting for September was held on Monday 20th and it was pleasant to sit in the clubhouse and not freeze to death for a change. Some of the highlights of the meeting were:

- The first of the proposed car park signs has been made and will be erected soon. The General Committee is looking for comment from members before proceeding with the proposal to erect more signs in the car park to boost revenue.
- Some preliminary planning is underway for the next 'Concert on the Course' event to be held later this year.
- Life membership working party established to look at the establishment of a set of basic criteria to be met before a member can be nominated for Life Membership.
- Women's Golf Victoria Country Championships to be held in the district on the 5th & 6th October. More details later in this edition.

The Club's Finances

I have been a bit reluctant to publish many details on the club's finances because I was concerned that other clubs would use the details against us. I think the time is now right to put the club's financial position on record.

Compared with the same time last year we are \$6,104.00 better off. This might not sound much, but in reality it is a god effort considering the circumstances. Compared with the same time last year golf activities, raffles, bar trading, fund raising are up and membership, catering, course activities, sponsorship and administration expenses are down.

For those that have been critical about the lack of activity around debt reduction, it is interesting to note that the total club debt in August 2003 was \$167,847 and in August 2004 it is \$143,180, or a reduction of \$17,667. Once again this might not sound much but given the comparison with the same time last year as set out above and the improvements that have been carried out it isn't a bad effort!

Information from 'Clubs Victoria'

Clubs Victoria is very concerned about proposed changes to the Liquor Control Reform Act and the impact that the proposed amendments may have on clubs. There are concerns with several aspects of the bill including the presence of minors on licensed premises, the definition of "responsible adult" and "in the company of" for the purposes of minors being on licensed premises, enforcement powers under the act and increased penalties relating to specific expenses. The General Committee is concerned about the impact the proposed amendments will have on our club and is supporting the approach by Clubs Victoria.

'A Very Risky Business'

An article with this name appeared in the latest issue of 'Golf Victoria' and it highlights a potential problem facing all players of golf. There have been a couple of recent cases that have highlighted the need for golfers to adequately protect themselves with appropriate insurance cover. The article is well worth reading, so get hold of a copy of 'Golf Victoria' Volume 45, Number 4 and have a read.

At the last General Committee meeting this issue was discussed as a result of advice from the Australian Golf Union that they had entered into an arrangements through Golf Australia Insurance Services to provide insurance cover for all players at an affordable price. To access the deal it is a requirement that 100% of the members of a golf club are covered by the 'AGU PIP Scheme'. If you were to buy the level of insurance offered as an individual the current cost would be approximately \$185.00. Under the AGU PIP Scheme, clubs can access the cover for \$14.00, provided 100% of members are covered. The scheme provides personal liability up to \$20 million as well as personal accident cover up to \$100,000.00. The scheme also covers a number of other things like loss or damage to equipment, third party personal injury and weekly loss of income cover. It is likely that many golfers are under the impression that their membership fees or their home insurance will provide them with the cover they need. This is not the case!

The General Committee discussed this issue at its last meeting and has taken the decision that the best way to ensure adequate coverage for all members is to impose a levy on club membership fees. As a result the 2005 full membership fee will increase to \$320.00 to enable all members to join the AGU PIP Scheme so that they are adequately covered every time they step onto a golf course.
