It is a good sign when the club is making a profit from its key activity and it is hoped that this trend will continue. Since the beginning of the club year in October 2004 we managed to reduce our debt level by \$19,622.00, which means we are still well on track to achieve our goal of reducing our debt by \$20,000.00 in the year. Whilst most indicators are good there are a couple of areas that are dragging us back a bit but these will be worked on throughout the remainder of the year. THE COURSE SUPERINTENDENT

Editor's Note: I have decided to allocate a large section of this issue to an update on the course from Tom Crawford.

In this report the strange noise of rain on the shed roof is a welcome sound. The region has been soaked in the past few days and for greenkeepers, gardeners and especially the farmers it is a welcome relief. It's nearly July and it's only now we can get the hose reel up, number and store away our most important asset on the course, the greenside hose!

The course is in reasonably good condition (I say reasonably because I am never totally happy, it could always be better) but in one way is a good thing, I think)

This is my first report for the WHACKER for some time, I must start by thanking the committee members, Marion, Les and especially Dads Army and other members who give their time and sometimes funds to assist on the course, much appreciated.

There are not many to go! Some of you will be happy to know that we have ceased tees construction, but only for a few months until extra finances are available! The men's 2nd tee was a TAFE project for 10 turf apprentices, they only had 6 hours so we will need to give it a good top dress and work on the aesthetics. Ladies, we are looking into redoing the tees on the 6th and 16th tees. When the warmer weather arrives all tees will receive a good top dress.

Overall we have a good cover of kikuyu, if money permitted I would like to scarify certain fairways that are a little bit on the other end of the scale cutting of tree roots would encourage a better surface in some areas. Over winter we are replacing some of the bare areas (middle of 1st and 14th) with instant turf, also improving the irrigation to those areas by installing as extending sprinklers to the front of greens where needed.

We are currently trying different fungicides to combat mushrooms on the 6th green. Every Monday we spray the green with good results- to the members who are doing a great job cutting them out please **stop** so we can work out if the fungicides are working or not. The occurrence of moss over the summer months (not just at our course) has curators puzzled. We are working on a program to eradicate this weed but I must warn that the greens may burn off slightly as we explore the various fungicides available. While trying to eradicate with spraying we must also look into the cause- a combination of old and poorly designed irrigation and poor drainage.

Shed: We have finally finished the long overdue office come smoko room, a very clean and dust free environment and volunteers. A special thanks to G Duffy, G. Bamford and Steve Weight for all their work. Graham Bamford is in DH & S and with myself is looking into safety issues.

De Dole: We are nearing the end of 2 six month projects and are lucky enough to be able to sign again with MADEC Consulting for another 6 months with that brings more funding to be used on the course. I am very grateful to these organisations for without their participants and funding we would be no where near as advanced as we are now in our course projects.

The General Committee has agreed to the introduction of a new computer controlled irrigation system to be installed on the course. The existing system has almost reached its 'use by date' and there are only a couple of places in Victoria where the existing system is still in place. As a result spare parts are becoming almost impossible to source. Although this will be a big expense, the long-term benefits will be a major boost for our course.
