Items from the Committee of Management

- RCGC to take control of the golf carts in order to maintain the service for members and visitors.
- 'Fairway 2000' returns a profit of \$2457.00.
- Some concerns expressed over water allocation for the coming year. The Greens Committee and Course Superintendent to keep this matter under close review.
- Concerns raised over the costs associated with maintaining the club's EFTPOS facilities. If the service is to be maintained members use of the facility would need to increase.
- Concerns raised about the number of members from last year that have not rejoined. A sub-committee was formed to look at this issue in more detail.
- There was agreement that the system of Course Marshals was important to maximise green fee collection and that more people are needed to assist.

'Golf Link – the way of the future or just another burden'

A number of readers may not even know what 'Golf Link' is. To help you understand this new and emerging system the following press release from the Australian Golf Union may be helpful.

Golf Link is a world class central handicapping system for Australian golfers that allows them to have their official handicaps calculated immediately their scores are sent to a central computer by their club. The members also have the convenience of being able to view their handicap and score history on the Golf Link website the next day. "With the proposed introduction of an Internet solution, members will be able to view changes and updates as they occur. The benefits of a uniform, centrally calculated and updated handicapping system is significant to a sport that has member clubs situated across Australia," said Colin Phillips, Executive Director of the AGU.

The AGU and Women's Golf Australia are keen to see the remainder of the clubs have access to the system via an Internet solution, but the future of the project is in the balance. Funding is the key to its future and for as little as \$2.50 (+GST) per member p.a. Golf Link can be assured of a sound financial base from which to continue current operations and upgrade its technology to make the system the remaining available to member Currently the AGU and the States are providing their affiliated golf clubs with detailed information about the proposal - the decision they make will be critical to the future of Golf Link. The AGU will hold its Annual General Meeting on September 19th when the introduction of the fee will be formally determined.

"Support at club and state level will ensure that Golf Link is available to all clubs on a modern platform capable of taking advantage of advances in operating and communications technology", said Mr Phillips. "This will see the project deliver to golfers a sophisticated, reliable and truly national handicapping system".

At its last meeting, the Committee of Management decided that the Red Cliffs Golf Club would not participate in 'Golf Link' at this stage. The Committee had received advice from the AGU that our members would not be disadvantaged by a decision not to participate. What do you think?
