Notes from the General Committee

- Sunday 2 November will be a combined event including: Presidents Day, Dinner, Draw for the Major Raffle, Variety performances, Melbourne Cup activities.
- The Bar profit is up \$33,000 from last year. The cash flow is reasonable with the overdraft manageable. The profits per month are holding.
- Core collecting machine. The machine is multi-functional and it will save time and money. It was agreed that the machine be purchased.
- The next stage of the Strategic Plan was discussed which focused on membership. It was agreed that a membership target of 400 should be set and a small working party was formed to advance the idea.
- A letter to Christie Walker congratulating her on her achievements was deserved. Ray Patterson raised the possibility of a Junior Support Fund, which will be investigated
- The untiring efforts of all volunteers was again recognized by the General Committee.

Special Article – A 'Potted' History of Red Cliffs Golf Club

At a meeting held on July 31st 1925 the Red Cliffs Golf Club was formed and a provisional committee of seven was elected under the leadership of Jack Trumble to select a suitable site and finalize the formation. On August 10th 1925 a further meeting was held and a committee was elected under the leadership of Jack Trumble and consisted of: A. Rich Secretary; Don Dunoon Treasurer and committee members Owen, King, Watts, Blake, Pollock, Miller, O'Neil, Kerr and Scouller. There were 38 foundation members and 24 Associates. A site was selected about three miles from Red Cliffs on the west side of the railway line opposite Sunnycliffs. A snapshot of important events:

- The course was laid out by Jack Scouller a surveyor with the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission
- The first nine holes was opened on May 1st 1926, with the second nine opened in 1927.
- The first Club Champion was W.Y Owen.
- At the 1928 AGM the club colours of Royal Blue and Gold were decided upon.
- In 1928 the club received a letter from Mildura and Wentworth clubs re the formation of District Association.
- In 1929 the Club's Pennant team won the flag in the District Association's first year.
- There were 255 entries in the club's first Open Tournament in 1929 held over 36 holes. The club recorded a profit of 75 pounds.
- During 1930 to 1934 'Sand Boys' were hired for 3 months to sweep the sands on Wednesday, Saturday and Sundays.
- In 1931 their were 39 ladies and a special mention was made of Mrs. Murray who each Wednesday, Saturday & Sunday left a billy full of milk on her gate post, which resulted in a considerable saving in costs.
- 1932 saw the completion of the 18th fairway and the introduction of the AIF Cup. The new clubhouse was also opened in 1932.
- In 1934 the social highlight of the year was the 'Golf Club Ball'.
- In 1935 /36 a start was made on planting grass on the fairways and the gum trees along the second fairway were also planted.
- I'll leave the rest of the history for another time!

Some great news items!

- 'Bobbie's Bistro' has raised over \$2000.00 from the winter Pasta Nights. Members might be interested to know that over ten years 'Bobbie's Bistro' has raised \$17,500.00 for the club. Where would we be without members like that?
- The recent Whyalla visitors rated Red Cliffs as the best and friendliest club to visit. They passed up an opportunity to play at Riverside, preferring to play at Red Cliffs twice.

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
